The outlook for consolidated operating results is based on information available at the present juncture and certain assumptions believed to be reasonable. 1. Analysis of Business Results and Financial Position

(1) Analysis of Business Results

In the six-month period ended September 30, 2021, the business environment of the Tsubaki Group remained challenging due to the global spread of novel coronavirus (COVID-19) infections, but it generally showed signs of recovery as a result of the economic policies of various countries, as well as progress in vaccination mainly in developed countries.

The speed of economic recovery in China has slowed down, but in the USA and Europe we have seen signs of recovery due to such factors as the governments' economic measures.

The economy in Japan is also showing signs of a recovery, which is partly attributable to the effect of various policies and an improvement in the economies of overseas countries. However, due to various factors such as increased costs of materials, the shortage of semiconductors, and restrictions on economic activity as a result of the renewed spread of COVID-19, the situation moving forward remains unclear.

In this environment, orders received by the Tsubaki Group for this six-month period were up 32.0% year on year to ¥113,182 million, and net sales increased 15.9% year on year to ¥102,518 million. Operating income increased 169.0% year on year to ¥8,185 million, and ordinary income increased 129.9% year on year to ¥9,156 million, while net income attributable to parent company shareholders increased 114.4% year on year to ¥6,624 million.

The Tsubaki Group will continue its efforts to prevent the spread of COVID-19 infections, while contributing to solving social issues through the use of Linked Automation Technology, as we work toward realizing "What we want to be in 2030" in the Long-Term Vision 2030.

We will also focus on both cultivating new businesses that will lead to sustainable growth and strengthening the earning power of our existing businesses, as we strive to achieve the Mid-Term Plan 2025 that we started this fiscal year.

(Linked Automation Technology: A technology domain that is highly functional and highly automated)

The Accounting Standard for Revenue Recognition (ASBJ Statement No. 29, March 31, 2020), etc., are being applied from the first quarter consolidated accounting period (three-month period ended June 30, 2021).

We have also changed some of the reporting segment categories and names, applicable as of the first quarter consolidated accounting period. The year-on-year comparisons listed below use the year-on-year figures reclassified into the changed segment categories. For details, please refer to "2. Consolidated Financial Statements (Segment Information, etc.)."
Segment results are summarized as follows:

[Chains]

In the Chains segment, net sales increased year on year due to such factors as a rise in sales in Japan, the Americas, Europe, Indian Ocean Rim, China, South Korea, and Taiwan.

Consequently, the segment recorded a year-on-year increase of 40.4% in orders received to \(\frac{\pmax}{39,951}\) million, a 22.1% increase in net sales over the same period to \(\frac{\pmax}{34,428}\) million, and a year-on-year increase of 68.8% in operating income to \(\frac{\pmax}{5,142}\) million.

[Motion Control]

In the Motion Control segment (previously the Power Transmission Units and Components segment), net sales were up year on year due to an increase in sales in Japan, the Americas, Europe, China, South Korea, and Taiwan.

Consequently, the segment recorded a year-on-year increase of 39.8% in orders received to \\ \pm 11,414 \\
million, a 9.1% increase in net sales over the same period to \\ \pm 9,321 \text{ million, and a year-on-year increase of 29.5% in operating income to \\ \pm 426 \text{ million.}

[Mobility]

In the Mobility segment (previously the Automotive Parts segment), net sales increased year on year due to such factors as a rise in sales of timing chain systems for automobile engines at bases in Japan, the Americas, Europe, Thailand, China, and South Korea.

Consequently, the segment recorded a year-on-year increase of 32.0% in orders received to \(\frac{\pma}{32,518}\) million, and a 31.5% increase in net sales over the same period to \(\frac{\pma}{32,419}\) million. Operating income was \(\frac{\pma}{3},648\) million (operating loss of \(\frac{\pma}{55}\) million in the same period of the previous fiscal year).

[Materials Handling Systems]

In the Materials Handling Systems segment, while we saw an increase in sales of systems for the logistics industry and life science field domestically, net sales were down year on year due to such factors as reduced sales of systems for the automotive industry in Japan and the Americas. Consequently, the segment recorded a year-on-year increase of 22.3% in orders received to \(\frac{\text{\tex

[Other]

Other orders received decreased 17.1% year on year to \$1,258 million, and net sales decreased 31.9% over the same period to \$1,042 million. Consequently, there was an operating loss of \$222 million (operating loss of \$171 million in the same period of the previous fiscal year).

(2) Analysis of Financial Position

(Assets)

Total assets at the end of the six-month period on September 30, 2021 were \(\frac{1}{3}\)18,168 million, up \(\frac{1}{2}\)10,835 million from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year.

Current assets totaled ¥154,526 million, an increase of ¥9,340 million from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year. This was partly due to an increase of ¥5,002 million in cash and deposits and an increase of ¥5,801 million in inventories due to an increase in products, despite a decrease of ¥1,602 million in notes and accounts receivables, and contractual assets.

Non-current assets amounted to \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{163,641}\) million, up \(\frac{\pmathbf{1}}{1,494}\) million from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year. This was partly due to a \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{2,299}\) million increase in investments in securities from a rise in the market value of securities held by the Company and other factors, which outweighed a \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{296}\) million decrease in tangible fixed assets due to amortization and other factors, and a \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{443}\) million decrease in intangible fixed assets.

(Liabilities)

Liabilities were \(\frac{\pmathbb{1}}{121,555}\) million, up \(\frac{\pmathbb{1}}{1,717}\) million from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year. This was because, although other current liabilities fell by \(\frac{\pmathbb{1}}{1,145}\) million due to a decrease in accrued expenses and unpaid consumption tax, electronically recorded monetary obligations increased by \(\frac{\pmathbb{2}}{682}\) million, non-operating electronically recorded monetary obligations increased by \(\frac{\pmathbb{7}}{737}\) million, income taxes payable increased by \(\frac{\pmathbb{7}}{746}\) million, and other non-current liabilities increased by \(\frac{\pmathbb{7}}{760}\) million due to an increase in deferred tax liabilities and other factors.

(Net assets)

Net assets were ¥196,613 million, up ¥9,118 million from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year, and the equity ratio was 61.2%. This was attributable to numerous factors, including a ¥1,425 million increase in the valuation difference on available-for-sale securities due to a rise in the market value of securities held by the Company, an increase of ¥2,471 million in foreign currency translation adjustments due to exchange rate fluctuations, and an increase of ¥4,954 million in retained earnings.

(Cash flow status)

Cash and cash equivalents (hereafter referred to as "cash") at the end of the second-quarter consolidated period amounted to \(\frac{4}{5}\)1,352 million, up \(\frac{4}{5}\)5,267 million from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year.

Respective cash flows and their causes are as follows:

(Cash provided by operating activities)

Net cash provided by operating activities was ¥10,632 million (up from ¥10,090 million in the same period of the previous fiscal year). This was attributable to various factors such as income before income taxes and minority interests of ¥9,104 million and depreciation and amortization of ¥6,268 million, which outweighed an inventory increase of ¥5,108 million.

(Cash used in investing activities)

Net cash used in investing activities was \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{3}\),487 million (down from \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{4}\),202 million in the same period of the previous fiscal year). This resulted from factors such as \(\frac{\pmathbf{3}}{3}\),707 million being used for the acquisition of fixed assets, despite income of \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{4}\)66 million because of refunds on time deposits.

(Cash used in financing activities)

Net cash used in financing activities was \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{2}\),528 million (up from \(\frac{\pmathbf{3}}{3}\)77 million in the same period of the previous fiscal year). This resulted from \(\frac{\pmathbf{1}}{1}\),722 million being used to pay for dividends, a \(\frac{\pmathbf{5}}{5}\)4 million repayment of debt, and other items.

(3) Discussion of Future Outlook including Consolidated Operating Results Forecast Based on the actual results for the second-quarter consolidated period and the current outlook, we have revised the full-term consolidated results forecast announced on May 11, 2021, for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2022.

The exchange rates used for the second half of this fiscal year, which is an assumption on which the full-term consolidated business results forecasts are based, are set at 1 USD = 111 JPY, and 1 Euro = 130 JPY.
